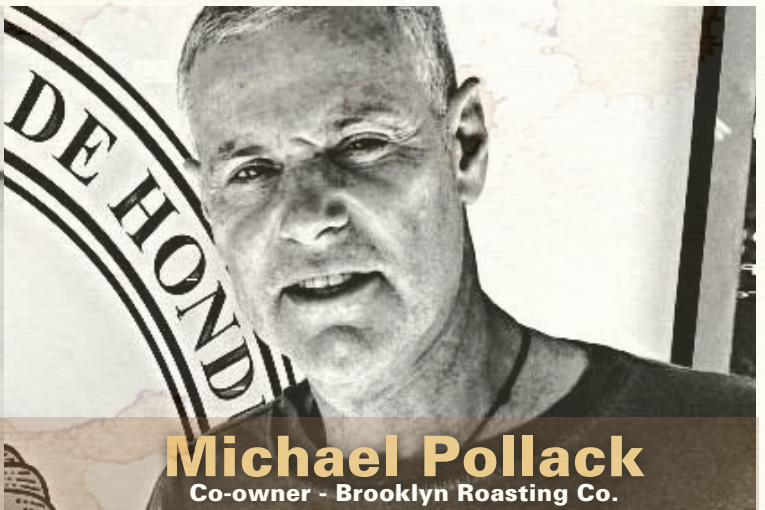
ITS HISTORY. ITS DECLINE. ITS RETURN.

Brooklyn Roasting, a "Roastery and Espresso Lab," occupies a building that once housed the nineteenth-century coffee roaster Arbuckle Coffee.
