Next Steps at The Brooklyn Navy Yard

Join us on Friday, March 15th to hear representatives of the Brooklyn Navy Yard and WXY Architecture + Urban Designs present the ambitious development and innovative educational programs of the Navy Yard's comprehensive Masterplan. The plan explores both "vertical manufacturing" designs and improved community accessibility and amenities. Learn more about the innovative approach to education and job training for Brooklyn high school students at the Brooklyn STEAM Center. A training hub that immerses 11th and 12th graders in real work environments, the STEAM Center provides local students with the skills and resources they need to thrive in the rapidly changing fields of manufacturing, technology, and creative industries.

The Brooklyn Navy Yard, a 300-acre industrial site, houses hundreds of small-scale advanced manufacturers, designers, artisans, and innovators. Owned by New York City and managed by the Brooklyn Navy Yard Development Corporation, the Yard provides affordable design, commercial, and production space to tenants. The proposed redevelopment seeks to expand the Yard's economic, physical, and community capacities to ensure sustained future growth.

Katie Beck Sutler is the VP of Workforce Development at the Brooklyn Navy Yard Development Corporation. In this role, Katie oversees strategy and programs to connect the 400+ companies of the Brooklyn Navy Yard to a talent pipeline of local community members, including through the Brooklyn STEAM Center, an innovative training hub for young people. Katie previously was Chief Operating Officer at 4.0 Schools, an education entrepreneurship incubator, where she led her team to provide programs for education entrepreneurs developing new technologies, programs, and school models.

He has a background in urban design, planning, and mobility, with more than 15 years of experience leading large-scale strategic and master plans for public and private sector clients, including extensive work for and coordination with New York City agencies, community development corporations, cultural institutions, and private developers.
